

More Winter Birds

Last November I introduced you to two of my favorite winter-resident birds – the Ruby-crowned and Golden-crowned Kinglets. Today I'd like to describe some other birds that you are likely to find feeding in the winter woods, and that might be traveling with the Kinglets. Yes, birds of a feather usually flock together, but in the winter woods you can frequently find small groups of birds that are composed of several different species. The likely mix in Fairfax woods in February will be Carolina Chickadee, Tufted Titmouse, White-breasted Nuthatch, and my favorite fluffball, the Golden-crowned Kinglet. The first three species are resident year-round, breeding throughout the southeastern United States. As I described before, Kinglets breed in the boreal forests of Canada, so we do not find them during the summer.



Carolina Chickadee

I've always found it curious that these birds travel together in flocks, because they all compete for the same scarce winter food. Perhaps they depend on one another to find the food, hoping that there will be enough for all. Chickadees and Titmouse are in the same family, the Paridae. Chickadees have black caps and bibs, while Titmouse have short crests. Nuthatches, in the family Sittidae, are similar in size and color to the Chickadees, with black caps, but they do not

have the black bib.

All three species eat insects and seeds, and will store food for later use by hiding a seed or insect in a crevice in tree bark. If you have a bird feeder full of sunflower seeds, you are certainly familiar with these birds. They fly to the feeder, choose the fattest seed and quickly fly away. Sometimes you can see them perch, hold the seed with their feet and hammer away at it with their straight, strong beaks until they crack it open. Other times, they

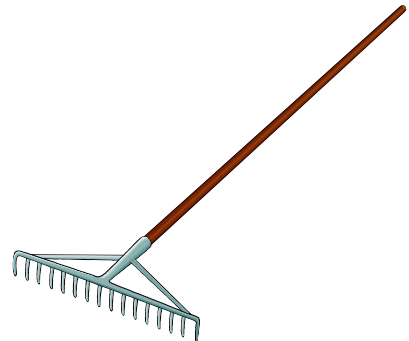
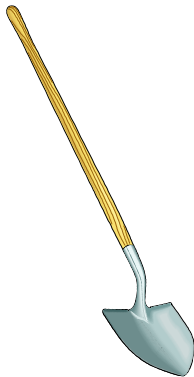

New Online Tool for Neighborhood Snow Plowing Status

Despite the spring-like temperatures Northern Virginia has experienced recently, it is still winter and VDOT has unveiled a new online tool to help northern Virginia residents stay informed about the snow plowing status of their neighborhoods.

Once it snows at least two inches, the new webpage <http://novasnowplowing.virginia.gov> will be activated and residents can find out the status of plowing in Fairfax, Loudoun and Prince William county neighborhoods.

Plowing status will be available for neighborhoods based on 600 "snow

maps" of northern Virginia streets. These are the maps users will view and be able to find out whether crews are plowing, have plowed or have not started a particular snow map. Street-by-street progress is not shown.

This is a test run. VDOT welcomes public feedback and promises to make adjustments to make the site as user-friendly as possible.

fly away to hide the seed for later use. All three species will hang upside down to feed, too. The Nuthatch, however, is the champion at walking upside down on tree bark. In fact, it is likely the only bird you will see that actually moves down the tree trunk. Woodpeckers and a smaller bird, the Brown Creeper, fly to a low spot and always work their way up the tree trunk. A Carolina Wren might occasionally take a hop down to a lower spot, but will not regularly walk down the bark of a tree hunting for food.

Chickadees, Titmice and Nuthatches all nest in cavities in dead or dying trees. As long as there are enough old trees around with a rotten limb or two, these birds will find a place to nest. However, because we do not want dead trees, or even trees with rotten limbs, near our homes, it is probable that these birds do not have enough nest sites available in our neighborhood. They will use nest boxes, if made the right size and placed at the proper height. One friend has had Chickadees use a nest box in a small dogwood trees in her front yard for several years and loves watching the parents care for the young. February is a good time to build a nest box and install it outside. The wood will then have time to weather before the birds move in. The Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology has all the information you need on its website: www.allaboutbirds.org, under the heading Birding Basics: nest boxes. Our local store for birding supplies, The Wild Bird Store, stocks standard sizes of nest boxes, too. A great family project, no matter what age you are.

Speaking of the Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology, you can join them in counting wintering birds during the Great Backyard Bird Count, February 17-20, 2012. You just commit to writing down the birds you see in one place for a certain time (1 hour, 3 hours, etc.) during any of those four days and send your tally in to the Lab. By joining forces with thousands of other participants across the country, you give the Lab valuable information about bird populations. Check their website for all the details. www.birdsource.org/gbbc/
